TOM'S UPDATE

When the pandemic hit, different leaders and sources I listen to, began to offer that the pandemic will basically speed up the development or age of an organization by five years. What was being proposed was the stress, resources, and abilities to adjust will reveal the health of any organization. We have all seen this in our communities. Some restaurants have been forced to close, while others seemed to have adopted and are thriving more than ever. Some businesses made an easy transition to online while others were not prepared, resulting in a loss of commerce or a closure.

This has certainly been true in churches. Part of my responsibilities involves leading the District of South Carolina Wesleyan Churches. Some churches were prepared for such a time as this while other churches were scrambling to provide ministry and care amidst the pandemic. Some churches were positioned to stream, produce and broadcast well while others played catch up. Some churches had already introduced online giving while others had not entered that arena when our lives, our society and our world were disrupted last year.

With this context, I am so proud of ALIVE and how well positioned we were heading into the pandemic. ALIVE was not only prepared to do ministry well and to care for our people, we actually were able to continue to advance the Gospel with new initiatives and ministry opportunities. If the pandemic added five years to every organization, ALIVE is doing well.

Instead of shutting ministry down, ALIVE began new ministries. Perhaps the most blaring example of this was the Mercantile. We sensed God leading us to consider the principle of Asset Based Community Development when it comes to all the resources ALIVE has. Stated another way, "During this time of uncertainty, what can ALIVE do, using what we already have, to help people in our communities?"



As I write this, two parts of the Mercantile are well under way. The cows are in the field and are growing. When the time is right, people will have the opportunity to purchase half a cow or a whole cow, to feed their families. The money ALIVE raises from those who purchase the beef will be poured directly back into our communities. Profits will be used to reach and care for the 96,000.

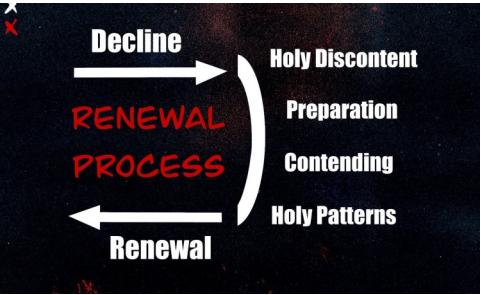
All the permits have been approved for the Exchange portion of the Mercantile and the building is under construction. The Exchange is a place for people in the ALIVE community to donate items they no longer need. Those items will then be sold. The Exchange will provide volunteer opportunities across our community as well as produce profit that will once again be used to reach and care for the 96,000.



The Orchard is still being dreamed about but has not developed into the plan as of yet.

Due to early investments in lights and cameras, when the pandemic hit, ALIVE was already prepared to deliver quality productions of our services. When the realization was made that we would be online for a period of time, ALIVE immediately upgraded lights and cameras. The beauty of these upgrades was the infrastructure and knowledge on how to operate these upgrades was already part of our production teams.

Of course, production can only go so far. If the product we have is not quality, production will not help. I was recently talking to a friend whose business is church production, specifically in audio, visuals and lights. He was sharing of how he was consulting with a large church in another state. He said, “Tom, they have everything. Their sound, lights and cameras are top of the line.” He let me know the sound board they just installed was nearing a \$100,000 price tag. He went on and said, “But there is one thing they do not have, that ALIVE has in spades.” Curious, I asked what it was. He said, “ALIVE’s voices are unmatched.” Our band and vocalists are unmatched.



In the past year, we spent 18 weeks in the Moving Beyond Motions Initiative. Instead of grieving the pandemic, we began to wonder what God might be up to. We started to ask the question “Is God up to something, seeking to move us from Spiritual Decline to Spiritual Renewal?” The impact of these messages focusing on Holy Patterns for living is still being felt in the ALIVE community.

In the midst of the pandemic our staff was able to continue ministry. We were learning how to socially distance, how to do testing, how to politely refuse admission to people with symptoms, how to continue to expose yourselves to people when everyone else is isolating. Despite numerous staff members fighting Covid, they kept showing up, kept pushing into new frontiers of ministry. We had three new staff members join us in the middle of the Pandemic and what tremendous gifts they all are to the ALIVE team. I am incredibly proud to be part of this team and to have them in my life.

This has been a year marked by division. Trying to lead a community through political and racial division, while fighting a pandemic, has certainly been challenging. For the most part, our community has responded with grace. It is comforting to this pastor’s heart to contemplate how well we have come through this past year. Our unity speaks to our health and our preparedness for God to continue to use us to reach spiritually hungry people.

ALIVE is a healthy community and God continues to honor us with resources, influence and most of all, His presence.

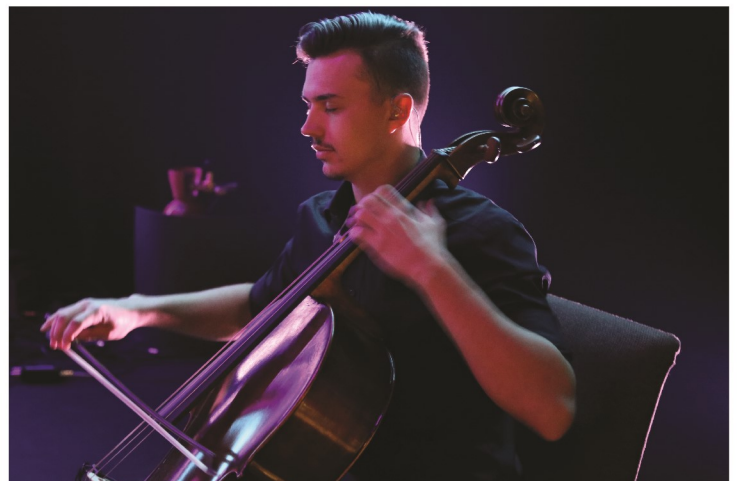

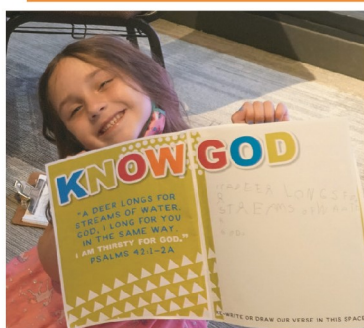

CARE

Care at ALIVE exists to walk with spiritually hungry people, celebrating with them in good times and hurting with them in bad times, pointing them towards Jesus, and caring for them as a healthy christian community.

WE SET OUT TO FOLLOW THE BIBLICAL INSTRUCTION TO...

“Be happy with those who are happy, and weep with those who weep.” (Romans 12:15)

On average, there are 50 individuals or families experiencing Care for grief, loss, marriage, diagnosis, recovery, addiction, and more.

ALIVE partners with an online organization that fields prayer requests using social media for people within 100 miles of ALIVE.

We've met about 100 of our 96,000 neighbors in the last 9 months through this tool. To date, 6 individuals have received care through this avenue.



THE LAST YEAR BROUGHT ALL KINDS OF 'FIRSTS' FOR ALIVE.

During the pandemic, a new one hit us! Someone found our church through mutual friends, and attends ALIVE online, all the way from Kansas! This person is experiencing ALIVE, while facing a very difficult diagnosis – kidney failure. Her prayers for a donor turned into a person – another member of ALIVE who has signed up to donate a kidney to her! They have met in person and surgery is taking place this spring. What a first!

One of our ALIVE families had a tree fall on their house during a large storm. They felt the 'close call' of their children all being awoken and leaving their rooms not long before the tree came through the roof of their bedrooms. In the hours, days, and weeks following, their small group rallied to encourage, clean, cook meals, pray and care for their kids. A team of volunteers brought tools, trailers, and helping hands to clear away brush and debris.

**It's unavoidable - bad things happen to everyone in life - but not everyone has a community of people who will drop everything to 'love their neighbor' in these moments.*

HELPING MARRIAGES LAUNCH WELL!

In addition to an incredible existing Re|Engage ministry, ALIVE began a premarital counseling process this fall. Since then, 8 couples have been a part of the process, and 5 mentor couples have signed up to help coach these couples into their marriages.

One of the most beautiful experiences in Care this year was watching a person move from being on the Care list to serving on the Care team! She was (and is) living with ongoing medical issues, but decided she wanted to reach out through calls, texts, and cards to others experiencing needs. Each month, this incredible lady prays for and encourages people on our Care list!

MISSIONS

SUPPORT FOR REFUGEES

We were able to send more than \$3,000 to our partner, Abel Nove, to care for refugees in Mozambique. This support was used to purchase and distribute food, supplies, and even land to care for refugees who fled a neighboring province due to violence.

COLLABORATION WITH ALIVE

During Kids week we shared videos from our missions partners which allowed ALIVE kids to meet the kids of the missionaries we support.

ALIVE Kids also provided Jesus Storybook Bibles to a kids ministry in Haiti!

MISSION PARTNERS SUPPORT

We continued support for our 8 ALIVE-sponsored missions partners:

Bagleys, Tolans, Seiberts, Stanleys, OKIPE Childrens Village, Rupak, and Abel.

REHABILITATE WELLS IN LIBERIA

In the Spring of 2020 ALIVE raised funds to rehabilitate wells in Liberia.



ALIVE gave over \$11,000 and our plan to sponsor 2 wells turned into 3 because of the generosity of the ALIVE community.

In October 2020 members of ALIVE traveled with World Hope to Liberia and were able to visit the wells the ALIVE community rehabilitated. They took ALIVE shirts with them to give to the church leaders.

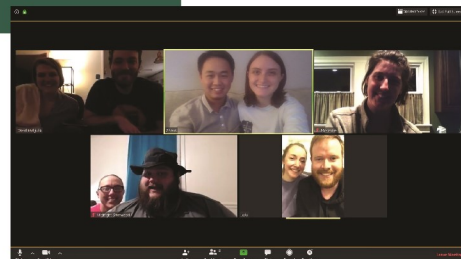
